Kindergarten Fees (information current as at: 28 January 2019)

Total daily rate: <i>Mt Gravatt Community Kindergarten receives funding from the government via the Queensland Kindergarten Funding Scheme (QKFS) which is deducted from the full fee charged to families.</i>	\$34.40 (five day fortnight) \$43.00 (two longer days per week) <i>(These fees reflect the reduced amount after the QKFS is applied)</i>
Inclusions in the total daily rate:	Sunscreen, visiting shows/incursions
Enrolment conditions:	Commitment to enrol in a 5 days per fortnight OR 2 days per week for a term of 10 weeks
Application of QKFS subsidy to reduce out-of-pocket expenses:	Available to eligible families with HCC/pension cards or families who identify as Aboriginal/Torres Straight Islander \$31.96 (five day fortnight) \$39.95 (two days/week)

Approved Kindergarten Program Providers

As an approved provider, this service holds a current Queensland service approval for a centre based service, under the Education and Care Services National Law (National Law) or the Education and Care Services Act 2013, and an appropriate public liability insurance of at least \$10 million. To be eligible to receive funding the service must provide a kindergarten program:

- To children who are at least 4 years of age by 30 June in their kindergarten year
- Delivered by a qualified early childhood teacher
- Aligned with the Queensland Kindergarten Learning Guideline, or other education program approved by the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority
- For at least 15 hours a week, 40 weeks a year or a minimum of 600 hours over 37 weeks for services operated by non-state schools.
